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


O1 Ardmore School




ASAA School Council Granted \$20,000 Medley CFB Grant Society Grant








03 **Aurora** Middle School

Over half of Aurora's students participated in the Lac La Biche Music festival and many received gold for their performances. Aurora hosted the final concert and had over 400 spectators!

















We were lucky to have a number of community agencies come to our parent teacher interviews to answer questions from our parents and meet many of our families and staff.















13 North Star Elementary School
